## **Summary**

Based on the data from Spring 2022's Regional Convention, our team decided that 16 students would attend LEADERSHPE Live during Spring 2023. SHPEXChange is a new virtual conference that many of our members seemed interested in attending. We decided that around 30 people would participate in these virtual conferences.

SHPE at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Prescott Arizona hosted a Noche de Ciencias, which is funded by the SHPE National Team. There was a surplus in SHPE ERAU at Prescott's budget for this event, and due to the fiscal year for SHPE National ending soon, and ERAU SHPE at Prescott not responding to the National Team, the National Team awarded us with the surplus as financial assistance towards the Spring 2023 Conventions.

Due to changing prices, limiting costs for certain events, and not finding certain items in our SGA Budget as necessary anymore, we were able to reallocate around \$950 more than what was indicated in the proposals towards the Spring 2023 Conventions.

Thanks to The Student Government Association's budget for our student organization, the generous donations by the ERAU's College of Engineering, ERAU's Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Coalition, and the SHPE National Team, we were able to fully fund these conferences for our members. 30 members had the opportunity to interact with industry-specific companies and their leaders to gain a new perspective on their future professional world during the virtual SHPEXChanges. These virtual conferences apart from allowing our members to hear seminars from industry leaders, had a career fair at the end which we are waiting patiently for results. The 16 members who went to the LeaderSHPE Live conference had the amazing opportunity to develop their professional skills, participate in group discussions, and more. These 16 members who traveled to Arlington Virginia did so with everyone traveling within the same flights, and staying in the same hotel.

## **Personal Remarks**

Valeria Slotter - LeaderSHPE LIVE was a great way to make connections and grow professionally. I got to meet people from different SHPE chapters, company executives, and industries that helped me grow my leadership and professional skills, while also making connections with other students who share similar goals and interests.

Adrian Moraga - It was a good change of pace. At nationals, you have 5 minutes to talk to a recruiter and never see them again. At Virginia, there was never that tension of needing to make an impression to get hired. Rather, it gave us a chance to meet and network with the recruiters that will be at nationals.

Lucas Cohen – With all the speakers and success stories we were presented with, LeaderSHPE Live acted as a liaison into my future. Oftentimes, it's difficult to see the light at the end of the tunnel when your journeys have only just begun. I learned a lot about networking and professional development.

Ana Alvarez - The Leadershpe Live was an opportunity to celebrate diversity, and get insight into potential challenges when starting a professional career. Industry professionals, graduate, and undergraduate students shared their professional/academic journeys. The Leadershpe Live helped students practice networking, interact with recruiters, and get a deeper understanding into what companies look for in a candidate.

Cameron Smith - It allowed for a more humanizing experience. I could talk without the anxiety of feeling like I'm being judged as a candidate. I had the opportunity to talk about my experiences and hearing about others was nice.
